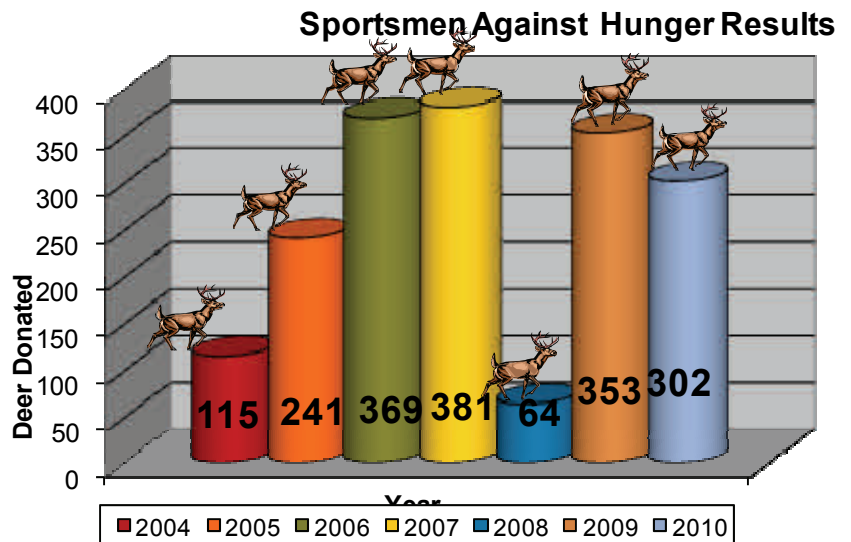

History:

In 2004, the North Dakota Community Action Partnership (NDCAP) initiated a statewide public education campaign to encourage local community sporting groups to develop a venison donation program. This campaign began after completion of statewide needs assessments. Assessments indicated that hunger, or not enough food to feed themselves and their families, has been demonstrated by low income participants as being the biggest need they have.

2010 results:

In 2010 the Sportsmen Against hunger program took in 302 deer. Deer were accepted throughout bow and rifle season.



In addition, SAH had the honor of partnering with the Theodore Roosevelt National Park in their elk reduction project this year. Through this partnership 91 cow elk were donated to SAH, the program secured funding to have the elk processed into burger, tenderloins, steak and roasts. After processing the meat was distributed to 70 different food pantries and charitable feed outlets across the state of ND.

The future of the Sportsmen Against Hunger program:

Community Action continues to look for dollars to cover processing costs in order to expand the SAH program. We are thankful for the generosity of clubs and other contributors.
